Minerals Council Absentee Ballot Request

Shareholders watch your mail boxes closely next week. The Minerals Council Election Board has prepared and is mailing to you an application for an absentee ballot. Expect to find yours in the mail during the week of March 29.

NOTE: It is important to know that the Minerals Council Election is completely separate from the Osage Nation Election. This means you will need to complete an absentee ballot application for the Minerals Election and then a different one for the Osage Nation Election. Remember that if you are voting absentee, you will need to complete two different absentee ballots.

Minerals Council Election Board Address

The Minerals Council Election Board Address is not the same as the regular Minerals Council address. To request Rules and Regulations from the

Rules and Regulations

Rules and Regulations for the Minerals Council Election are attached. Consider that this is not signed by the Chairman therefore it is unknown if these Rules and Regulations are final. As soon as a signed document is available, I will forward it on to you and post in on my website.

Other Election:

I am attaching the application for an absentee ballot which is required in order to vote in the Osage Nation Election. This ballot will cover the election of the Chief, Assistant Chief, Congress and Judicial.

Report on Absentee Ballots

Yesterday, Thursday, March 25, I declared my candidacy for Congress. While at the Election Board office, Ms. Otipoby, Election Supervisor, informed me that only 98 absentee ballot requests had been received.

Those planning to vote absentee are encouraged to get your request form sent in as soon as possible. You will be assisting the Election Board by doing so as well as ensuring yourself that you have completed that necessary step. Even though the filing dates for candidates have not yet expired, having your name on the list to receive an absentee ballot in a timely manner should ensure that your votes will be counted.
