## TALEE REDCORN – CAUTIONS

SHAREHOLDERS  
Talee Red Corn posted a caution to the Shareholders on the Osage Shareholders Forum. Talee's concerns are relevant and I want to share them with you in case you didn't get his message:

*"Not to join in on the political fray, but I want to educate our shareholders about any efforts to back renewable energy efforts, especially Obama's renewable efforts.*

*Problem is, in order to pay for Obama's renewable efforts, increased taxes on conventional oil and gas have been proposed.*

*The Osage Minerals Council recently sent a letter to the Osage Producers Association supporting their effort to oppose increased taxes for conventional oil and gas producers as pushed by Obama.*

*I would caution public support for renewable efforts unless we Osages study the implications, especially when 60 to 70% of our headright checks come from smaller oil and gas companies that operate on the Osage and since we Osage have 1.5 million acres of minerals reserve but only roughly 3,000 acres of surface that could support any renewable efforts."
